

A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

The African American family act, "Hines, Hines and Dad," which featured late drummer, Maurice Hines, Sr. and his two, gifted, child-star sons, the late Gregory Hines and his older brother, Maurice, Jr, were often the opening act for the great Ella Fitzgerald. Between shows, young Maurice preferred to hang around with Ella in her dressing room, where he'd witness the rarely seen backstage persona of the first lady of song. Young Hines also observed Ella's interactions with her cousin/dresser, Georgiana and her manager Norman Granz. Years later, both brothers became even bigger stars (see "The Cotton Club" movie) and while performing in the tour of a Broadway show, Maurice overheard his co-star, recording artist and timeless beauty, Freda Payne, "scatting" as her vocal warm-up. He ran to her and said, "Freda, you sound like Ella!" In 2002, when Washington's Arena Stage commissioned a musical from Hines, he chose to celebrate the Ella Fitzgerald he'd known as a child - and he invited me to write the musical and Freda to play her. In the years since, we have shared several developmental productions as I have continued on my path as a dramatist, earning an MFA from NYU/Tisch's Graduate Musical Theatre Writing Program - and garnering recognition writing and directing, including winning the 2018 AUDELCO award for "Best Director of a Musical". Presently, as Hines' health prohibits him from joining us, I am blessed to continue his vision of Ella, alongside the incomparable Freda Payne. I would like to thank Molloy University, Angelo Fraboni and his amazing team for inviting me back, as, over twelve years ago, another of my shows, Off Broadway's From My Hometown, was the first musical he produced at the Madison Theatre. On behalf of the cast, creative and production teams, musicians, designers and house staff, we thank you for supporting our art as we celebrate the immeasurable contributions of the First Lady of Song, Miss Ella Fitzgerald.

CAST

Freda Payne (Ella Fitzgerald) is an award-winning singer, artist, actress, and best-selling author. As a recording artist she has been Grammy nominated, Gold record awarded, and a million-selling sensation. Her first albums and singles date back to the early 1960s, but she will always be associated with her million-selling Number One hit "Band of Gold" (1970). With a series of her recordings produced by legendary Motown production team, Holland-Dozier-Holland, it was in 1971 that Freda's Contact album became her biggest seller, containing several hits including her second Gold single, "Bring The Boys Home." While she is famous for her early '70s hits like "You Brought The Joy," and "Deeper and Deeper," she started her career as a jazz singer, and as a teenager she performed with Duke Ellington, and Pearl Bailev. She also later worked with Quincy Jones, Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis Jr., and Bob Hope. Once her recording career was established, she shifted gears and scored two disco / dance hits: "Love Magnet" (1977) and "In Motion" (1982). Freda is also an accomplished actress. She was Leslie Uggams' understudy in Hallelujah Baby! on Broadway in the 1960s, and she was called upon to as the star of the show on five occasions. In the early 1980s Freda starred in her own syndicated TV series, Today's Black Woman. Starting in the 1980s Freda began showing off her acting skills by staring in the touring companies of Tony Award-winning shows: Duke Ellington's Sophisticated Ladies, Jelly's Last Jam, and Blues In The Night. She has also appeared in several films, including Book of Numbers (1973) and Nutty Professor II: The Klumps (2000). Her younger sister, Scherrie Payne, is an accomplished singer as well, and was a member of The Supremes in the 1970s. In 2021 Freda released her first book. the memoir Band of Gold, written with Mark Bego. Her latest album release is entitled Let There Be Love (2021), including a duet with Johnny Mathis. Freda lives in Encino, California.

Bobby LaVell (Reeds) Born in Memphis, Tennessee Bobby LaVell gained an interest in music while in high school. He became proficient on the Saxophone, Flute, Clarinet and Piano while pursuing formal musical studies at Memphis State (now the University of Memphis), and Shelby State College. He has performed with BB King and Ray Charles. Bobby has also performed with such fixtures as The Temptations, The Four Tops, and The Nicholas Brothers. Additionally, there have been performances with Harold Mabern and George Coleman. He is regular member of The Jimmy Heath Big Band. For a while he performed with The Chico

O'Ferell Big Band. He performed with Slide Hampton's Jazz Masters for three years until the band was shut down. Bobby still maintains a close working relationship with Mr. Hampton. He is also a member of The Manhattan Symphony Jazz Orchestra conducted by Dennis Mackrel. He was a member of The Duke Ellington Orchestra for almost 20 years. With his own intuition Bobby founded and leads "The Bobby LaVell Jazz Orchestra", formally "The Hudson River Jazz Orchestra". He worked with a Big Band conducted by Benny Golson. And for the last four years he has been a member of Ron Carter's Great Big Band.

CREATIVE TEAM

Lee Summers (Director/Book) Lee Summers returns to the Madison Theatre at Molloy University, having recently directed Hair: The American Tribal Love-Rock Musical for the Hawaii Performing Arts Festival. In June, Summers premiered a reading of his newest musical about gay civil rights leader, Bayard Rustin - and in July, he served as a quest director at Berklee College. Awarded 2018's AUDELCO award for "Best Director of a Musical" for On Kentucky Avenue, Summers has directed works for numerous New York and regional theatres and universities, nationwide. He has also directed numerous short films and virtual productions. Summers made his Broadway debut in the original Dreamgirls-and for which he later reprised his role in the Dreamgirls 20th Anniversary Concert, alongside Audra McDonald, Billy Porter, Heather Headley and other Broadway notables. He got his start as an actor at HBCU, Tennessee State University while simultaneously singing and dancing at Opryland, U.S.A. Since then, Summers has performed On and Off-Broadway, and in major American repertory theatres and numerous roles for daytime and primetime TV, including, "Blue Bloods," "Boardwalk Empire," "New York Undercover," "Law and Order" and in films such as "Malcolm X" directed by Spike Lee. These days he admits he landed on the cutting room floor of "Head of State," starring and directed by Chris Rock. As a writer, lyricist and composer, Summers' works have been produced in New York and

by numerous regional theatres. Notably, he served as conceiver/co-writer/co-composer and lead producer for Off-Broadway's From My Hometown, which was later produced at the Madison Theatre at Molloy and soon to be published by Broadway Musicals. Presently, Summers serves as adjunct faculty at NYU's Steinhardt Department of Music and Performing Arts Professions. After Tennessee State, Summers earned his BA from SUNY Empire State College and his MFA from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts.
